SENIORS - The school year is almost over. □ Please note the following reminders for the end of the year.

- All fees, charges for overdue or lost books, lunchroom charges, etc. must be paid before graduation.
- Caps and gowns will be available soon.
- There will be a sign-up sheet at graduation practice to let the guidance office know where your final transcripts should be sent.
- Tell the guidance office about any awards or scholarships that you've received so that you can be recognized at the senior awards assembly on May 21.
- You must have five (5) points to pass a class. Two of these points must be in the second half of the class—don't let up too early!
- OGT scores for seniors should be in on May 12.
- Graduation information for the Circleville Herald must be in by April 25. You must take it to the Herald office after this date.
- Several colleges are still accepting applications—if you aren't sure, ask!

Important dates and times

- Pickaway-Ross will hold their completion ceremony at 7:30 p.m. on May 15.
- The senior awards assembly will be May 21 at 8 a.m. Your presence is expected and appreciated.
- Senior exams will be May 28 and 29.
- Graduation practice will be held on May 30 from 8:30 – 10:30 a.m.
- GRADUATION will be Sunday, June 1, at 3 p.m. Students should arrive by 2 p.m. Proper dress is required. No jeans, shorts, or tennis shoes will be accepted.

JUNIORS

- You must have five (5) points to pass a class. Two of these points must be in the second half of the class—don't let up too early!
- Students who are deficient in credits and wish to enroll in a correspondence course for a failed course should pick up an application in the guidance office. The cost (\$114) is your responsibility. You have six weeks to complete each course. Another option is through the Virtual Learning Academy. See a counselor for more information.
- March OGT test results should be in by May 22.
